Maths lessons at Madeley School

This week a group of six Y6 pupils spent an afternoon at the high school being taught Maths by Mr Woodfine, alongside children from various other primary schools. These monthly sessions are aimed at our more able mathematicians who are working considerably above age related expectations. This week they enjoyed a shape treasure hunt and a very challenging arithmetic test set to music, which involved answering

100 questions in 100 seconds!

Maths Focus

One of our school development priorities this year is to improve children's fluency and rapid recall of number facts. We have found that lots of our children take too long recalling times tables, number bonds etc. Our FUN maths session are already having a positive impact and it's very rewarding for the children to see at the end of a week how much they have improved with daily practise. Each morning we have a daily maths workout which is a fun and energized way of mastering these facts.

Last week, both Mrs Kuffour and I spent a morning in each classroom observing the teaching of Maths and how children responded to their learning. We were very impressed with the children's positive attitude towards Maths and how they

are able to apply their knowledge to a wide variety of problems. We have noticed though that some of our children are slipping into bad habits with presentation, so will be monitoring this carefully and have asked the children to raise expectations of themselves. We will also further develop the use of a maths tool kit, where children have to develop different strategies which they can rely on according to a question type. For example: odd one out, true or false, always, sometimes or never true. All of these skills will further equip our children to meet the increased expectations of the maths curriculum and see Maths as so much more than a page full of calculations.

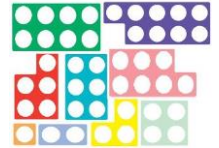
It was highly evident, in all of the classrooms, that our behaviour policy is firmly embedded and understood by our children. There is a most positive learning environment and every single minute of the lesson is used to maximise learning. The amount of work recorded each lesson shows just how hard working and engaged our learners are. We really can evidence that the behaviour of our children is OUTSTANDING!!


Numicon Workshop

On Thursday, parents and family members of pupils in Class One (Reception) and Y1 (Class 2) were invited in to school to participate in a Numicon Family Workshop. Here they had the opportunity to learn more about the resources we use in school to support learning in Maths.

It was so wonderful to see teachers, TAs, parents and children all engaged in their maths learning. I was so impressed with how brilliant the children were at communicating using mathematical language and showing great reasoning skills.
