There was an anomaly, as one person responded that whilst they believe all staff to be approachable, they do not feel comfortable in raising a concern. We do pride ourselves on being friendly and understanding of the challenges of family life.

There was overwhelming positive support expressed for the school and all the staff through the open comments received. A snapshot of these is:

"It is a small, close knit school which promotes good values and a love of learning."

"Children who join the school later on are welcomed and supported. It is so easy for them to make friends and settle. They make so much progress very quickly. The other children really do help them feel welcome."

"The staff go above and beyond to ensure all children are included."

"Children are pushed academically."

"Friendly staff, super behaviour, everyone knows everyone, children play with each other across the year groups."

"Mrs Procter is a known face to children and parents. She says hello to each child every morning."

"It is noted the attention that is given to not only developing the children's academic abilities but also personal attributes, that will ensure success throughout life."

"The staff are always supportive and have time for you. Nothing is too much trouble."

Of course we did also receive some developmental feedback which is well received. We know that we should always strive to do things even better and appreciate the parental perspective. These comments can be summarised by the table below, together with our actions.

<b>Development Points</b>	<b>Actions</b>
Our youngest class is sometimes referred to as Reception and then other times Class 1. This makes it confusing for parents in text messages.	We totally understand and therefore from September this class will only be referred to as Class 1.
There are limited clubs for Reception compared to other classes.	The school does feel that our youngest children are very tired at 3:30pm and most are just ready for chill time and a snack. We do only have 6 members of staff who run clubs in their own time. This makes it challenging to extend our extra-curricular provision. We have investigated the parental appetite for a French club for our younger children which would be run by an external provider. Currently, we are short of a few more children to make this viable.
Parking was mentioned numerous times. Parents feel that despite requests, certain parents continue to park dangerously. A request for a lay-by was made.	As you know we regularly remind parents about safe and considerate parking in the newsletters. It would be for the Council to make alterations to the nearby roads. They and the Police are highly aware of our concerns. We do not feel the school is not in a position to take any further action.
A concern was expressed regarding the possibility of combining the two primary schools in Madeley.	The school is in the process of converting to an academy with Shaw Education Trust. This will provide security for the school's future and bring future opportunities for the improvement of the school building.

More links with the high school.	The two schools are now working closer than ever, which has enabled our Y5 children to visit on numerous occasions and enjoy taster lessons. Our academy conversion will develop such links greatly.
Do Jo Awards - Can we send a letter home when the child brings home the certificate to provide more details?	The Secret of Success, for which they have achieved the certificate for, is clear on the certificate. There is one person chosen from each year group on a weekly basis. We celebrate this in our Friday celebration assembly. Response to bullying.	It is exceptionally rare to receive concerns regarding bullying. In the last year there have only been two concerns brought to the school's attention. In both cases our policy was fully adhered to and both matters were resolved. Our staff do respond instantly and where a child is proven to have bullied another child, they are dealt with according to our policy. All parties concerned are supported as appropriate. Governors are informed of such issues on a termly basis. Fallings out between children are inevitable and unkind words can be said without the child concerned, understanding the impact. This is not bullying. I can categorically assure you that the children are never violent to one another and we even have a zero tolerance to "play fighting". Whilst everyone recognises that our Sports Day at Keele is enjoyable for the children, some parents would like our venue reviewed.	We will explore an outdoor venue such as Leycett CC. However we would still continue our rotation of activities, as the traditional races provide very little activity and most of the time is spent spectating. The weather can be unreliable and in the case of wet weather or very hot weather, it would have to be postponed or even cancelled. We know lots of our parents book the time off work in advance, which would be wasted.

Whilst such parental surveys are conducted annually, your feedback is welcome at any point throughout the year. Through open dialogue, we can work together to provide the very best provision and achieve the highest academic and personal outcomes possible, for all the children. As parents, your perspective into life at The Meadows is most valuable. However I would also like to point out that negative and mostly inaccurate information discussed through social media and on the playground, is not productive for the children whatsoever.

We have been praised repeatedly for our approachable nature, so we are here to listen and help at any time.
